Employing a 'fresh ears' approach to intermittent auscultation, whereby a second midwife confirms the fetal heart rate pattern every hour, may reduce interpretation errors. (Local clinical management and midwifery staff) When there is a concern regarding the fetal heart rate, immediate help should be sought. (All clinical staff)

Improving fetal monitoring

Doppler velocimetry provides valuable information about fetal status. We offer a practical approach to management and timing of delivery based on available data in the literature. Clinical management of fetal growth restriction, a complex obstetric problem, should incorporate antenatal testing and Doppler ultrasonography in the context of gestational age.

Therefore, a multidisciplinary evaluation of a child or adult suspected of having FAS (or FASD) is a reasonable approach. This multidisciplinary team should include: a physician experienced in evaluating a broad range of developmental disabilities (both genetic and teratogenic), a psychologist and/or neuropsychologist, an educational specialist, and a skilled maternal interviewer.

Application of fetal monitoring during surgical procedures, during perimortem cesarean birth, and in women who have irreversible loss of brain function is included.

Maternal, risk-based therapeutic approaches range from invasive protocols to relatively benign noninvasive strategies to avoid serious procedural complications. Intravenous immunoglobulin (IVIG) with or without steroids and fetal blood sampling constitute the mainstay of antenatal management.
