Children with autism frequently have trouble with changes in routine, paying attention to vocal instructions alone, and self-monitoring. Almost as if to compensate, some children autism have strengths in rote memory and the ability to understand visual information (7).

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Most kids with autism need frequent breaks and a reduced homework load. Use your child's special interests as motivation. For example, a structured homework schedule might be that every day your child comes home and has a snack. She does 30 minutes of homework followed by a short break.

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
